Directors Corner

Natalie Berdahl is City of Lakes Chorus newly hired director and I am excited to share her answers to my questions so we can all get to know her a bit better!

Tell us about your family and what brings you to Minnesota and City of Lakes Chorus.

Born and raised in Montana, I spent summers at my family lake cabin near Fergus Falls, Minnesota.

After 30 years in Montana, life took me to Texas, then Ohio, and now it's time to return home up North. I have always wanted to live in Minnesota and I have family here.

Since I was 19, my dream was to be a Top 10 chorus director and give back to the organization that built me into who I am today. But I never had the opportunity. Watching the Region 6 2024 competition, I saw the City of Lakes director ad. With my path of moving to Minnesota already started, I applied. In my first audition with the chorus, our energies combined, we blew the roof off the rehearsal hall! It was a GREAT fit. We are so excited to get to know each other and start our new journey together.

What is your music background?

Outside of having 3 music directors in the family, my Mom is also a piano teacher. I played the saxophone in the high school band and sang in the choir. All my education comes from Sweet Adelines and the Barbershop Harmony Society. It is the best education you could ever have, and I am always learning.

Other than barbershop, what is your favorite kind of music?

I have a wide variety of music tastes. It all depends on what I feel like. It can range from Mariah Carey to Armin Van Buuren (trance dance music), to Metallica to Hans Zimmer film scores. I grew up loving 50's music from cruising around the lake with my Uncle in his pontoon. Country music? Hmm... I love to two-step to it? Hilariously, I am not a fan of musicals. Huh?? I know... But I enjoy hearing the songs in barbershop arrangements. Except The Phantom of the Opera is my all-time favorite. I always wanted to be cast as Christine Daae.

If you were marooned on a desert island and could only listen to one song, which one would it be?

"Elysium" Gladiator soundtrack. Composer Hans Zimmer.

What are you most looking forward to with the City of Lakes Chorus?

Our new direction. Who do we want to be? What do we want to do? The opportunity of: How can we help continue to move the organization in the right direction? What can we do for Region 6? All of it. A big transition of change can be scary and cause some nervousness, but we are doing it TOGETHER. Deciding what we want and goal-setting together. I am excited about the sisterhood, the laughs, and my new "family." I am anxious to see where our new path leads us!

Show or Competition? Which is your favorite and why?

Both? 12 years of my barbershop history stem from a small chorus life. There is something about the joy of shows, cabarets, and sing-outs, where you share your music with the public in different settings. It exposes you to so many



different audiences and shares your love of barbershop with your community. The interaction with people can be heartwarming and provide opportunities to attract new members. You get to shake someone's hand and hear them tell you how much they LOVED your performance! And their day is better because they heard you sing.

Also the fun annual shows, spring shows, writing scripts, and finding costumes for the theme. And don't forget the memorable chaos of switching costumes in 10 minutes, while hoping the emcee talks slow enough for you to change! The panic of helping another member who can't find her earring or get the zipper up and hurrying to the stage half-dressed because you're about to go on! The curtain opens and you are panting heavily but smiling as big as you can like nothing happened! To the afterglow, opportunities to hear chorus quartets get up and sing.

Now competition... I do have a very competitive side. Outside of loving to compete, there is a side of me that is constantly improving myself. In competition, you are exposed to new choreography, new songs, and costumes. Competition always motivates you to work harder and you receive feedback on what you need to improve on!

Ballads or uptunes? Which ones do you prefer?

I am a ballad junkie to the core! I could listen to an entire contest of ballads! The raw emotion, grabbing the audience's heartstrings, big dramatic chords, and the epic barbershop swipes! Those big dramatic 2-second pauses before starting the next phrase... creating that beautiful silence in the entire arena / performance hall before you continue on in your storytelling. Leaving the audience at the edge of their seat staring and wanting more... To laying them out with those crushing tags! If you made them cry, you did your job!

Do you have a favorite quote?

Rocky Balboa – Speech to his son who doesn't believe in himself. "You, me or nobody, is going to hit as hard as life. But it ain't about how hard you hit... It's about how hard you can GET hit and keep moving forward... How much you can TAKE... and keep moving forward... That's how WINNING is done."

I subscribe to "Daily Vocal Tips" from New York Vocal Coaching, and thought this was a pretty good one to share with you all:

"Get TALLER as you exhale!" This is a classic Vocal Tip given to singers to improve posture, breathing, and technique. But what does it mean? Well, when we exhale to sing, there is a tendency to let the air escape too fast and too aggressively. We tend to squeeze the upper abdominals and thrust the chest downwards. These habits lead to pitch problems, register imbalances, lack of stamina, and even vocal strain. Luckily, it can all be fixed by getting TALLER! As you sing a phrase (particularly a long phrase), imagine your sternum, the back of your neck, and the crown of your head all growing taller and taller. You'll notice an immediate difference to your vocal freedom, control, and stamina. In short, good singing can be as easy as getting TALL!


Acapella Express Chorus

Now little girls in Bismarck can dream of growing up to be firefighters, too. That's because Bismarck has made history by hiring the first female professional firefighter in the state.

"I divin t set out to make history, out I in not afraid of it," said Linda Harmsen. She's one of seven new hires the department made as it gets ready to staff a new northwest station on Tyler Parkway. The group began two months of training this week. While North Dakota women have been volunteer friefighters in some of the state's small towns since "As a department, we feel pretty proud," said "irre and Inspections Chief Jack Hegedus, "We've een working towards it." The holdup has been the right combination of a voman who could meet the requirements and comen who were interested, Hegedus said.

but Harmsen took and passed the same agility test as the others. The test is the same given by the National Guard, he said, which has plenty of female members. He said Harmsen's performance there settled a

t of doubts among the guys. "There was a big question mark until she went rough her agility test and she did as well or better an some of the younger men," he said. Harmsen 45 years old.
